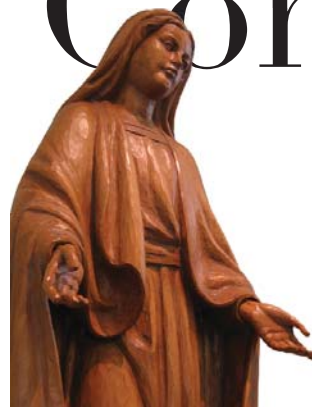

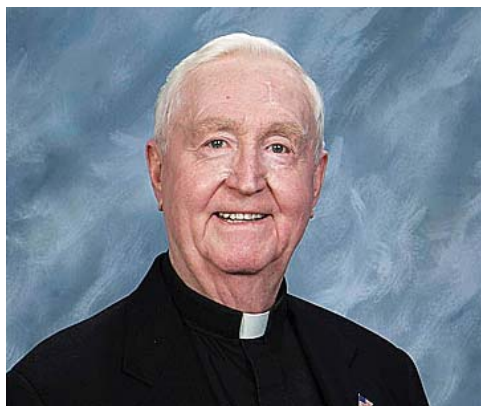

1969-72, and director, 1972-75. He was an assistant at Mary Queen of Heaven, Mill Basin, 1975-78. In 1978, he was named pastor of St. Rose of Lima, where he served until 1988. He was the administrator of Our Lady of Skies from 1988 to 2005, retiring on Jan. 1, 2006. Father Devine counseled the families of the victims of PanAm 103, which was blown on up in 1988 by terrorists over Lockerbie, Scotland on it's route from London to JFK and TWA Flight 800, which crashed over Long Island in 1996. Fr. Jim was actively involved pastorally in the aftermath of September 11, 2001 attacks, especially by conducting funerals of the fallen members of the Port Authority Police Department. He was the President of the International Association of Civil Aviation Chaplains, 1993-99. In 2005 the Catholic Guild at JFK chose Fr. Jim as the Man of the Year at the Annual Luncheon. Fr. Jim currently lives at Bishop Mugavero Residence in Douglaston.

FATHER JAMES T. DEVINE, the retired administrator of Our Lady of the Skies Chapel at Kennedy Airport, will celebrate a Mass of thanksgiving at St. Rose of Lima Church, Rockaway Beach, on Sunday, June 13, at 11:00 AM. Born in Manhattan, Father Devine attended St. Francis de Sales School, Belle Harbor; Cathedral Prep and College, Brooklyn; and Immaculate Conception Seminary, Huntington. He served as an assistant at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament, Bayside, 1960-69, and was assistant diocesan director of the Catholic Youth Organization,

South Africa: World Cup and... Peace Cup

The Catholic Church in Southern Africa is organizing a Soccer Peace Tournament in the Township of Atteridgeville, Pretoria, at the same time as the FIFA World Cup (June/July 2010). The aim is to bring together fans of different social classes, different ethnicities, and national origins as well as fans from all over the world. This football Peace Tournament has an international dimension. 64 players from about 15 countries will play every Saturday from June 5th to July 3rd in the poorest part of the Township, on a locally designed football pitch. Four teams will be created out of the two best teams of Atteridgeville and migrants living in South Africa and fans coming for the World Cup. The final will take place on July 3rd.

The Peace Cup's objective is to seize the Fifa World Cup's opportunity to spread the values that our societies so much need, especially in Africa. These are values that the Church does not cease to advocate: charity, dialogue with other religions and cultures, justice, solidarity, fraternity, non-violence... Sport is a recognized instrument for promoting these values, as it disregards both geographical borders and social classes. It also plays a significant role as a promoter of social integration and economic development in different geographical, cultural and political contexts. Problems in post conflict situations can be eased as sport has the ability to bring people together.

In its efforts to use sport as a catalyst for peace and social development, Caritas International (CI) and Damietta Peace Initiative (DPI), the two organizers of this Peace Cup, are working in grass-roots communities to build multi-ethnic, multi-faith and community-based peace groups through Africa with the aim of creating relationships within groups and between individuals who understand the importance of non-violence, empowerment and youth education.
